12 Questions to Ask a Potential Contractor

The simple truth is, not all home renovation companies are equally capable, reliable, and respected. Before investing in any remodeling project, take the time to do your due diligence and research, ask questions, and be unapologetic about it! It's your home and you deserve the best for your money.

The questions below are just some of many to ask before committing to a remodeling company.



☐ Will the remodeler provide references from past clients?
☐ Is the company insured for both liability and workers' compensation?
☐ Does the remodeler have a physical office space? (If so, take the time to visit it.)
☐ Does the contractor have the required contractor registration? Certification for the new federal "lead safe" mandate?
☐ How long has this remodeling business been in operation?
\square Is the remodeler associated with any professional organizations, such as NKBA (National Kitchen & Bath Association), NARI (National Association of the Remodeling Industry), HBA (Home Builders Association), etc.?
☐ Has the contractor completed any jobs near your home? If so, how many?
$\ \square$ Has the company ever been featured in any magazines or journals, or won any noteworthy awards?
☐ Does the contractor have a portfolio to view, either in person or online?
☐ Does the contractor have an appropriate professional vehicle to suit your project's needs?
☐ Will the contractor provide an up-front warranty on the work to be performed?
☐ Do you feel the contractor has your best interest at heart?

Always remember, when vetting a remodeler, the old adage applies: Measure twice, cut once! That is, ask all the questions that are relevant to your project before signing any contracts.
